

Rebate Program

Rebates are available for issue for the following amounts and devices as of July 20, 2010:

- \$50 for high-efficiency washing machine
- \$50 for replacement of older style greater than 1.6GPM with a low-flow toilet (1.5GPM or less/dual flush modes)
- \$100 for each 0GPM urinal new installation or retrofit
- \$75 for tankless water heater replacement or new installation
- \$20 for low-flow faucets
- \$15 for low-flow shower heads
- \$25 for purchase of a evaporation-minimizing pool cover
- \$100 for installation of a 300 gallon or greater rain-harvesting system
- \$100 for replacement of a homeowner's galvanized steel or lead service line

Devices submitted for rebate consideration must meet the standards applicable for the particular item in question, as determined by the District. Current standards and approved devices for rebates are encompassed within the EPA's *Water Sense Program* and can be found on the EPA's website, www.epa.gov/watersense. Devices that are not listed on the EPA's website, but are listed above, will be determined to be available for rebate by the District on a case-by-case basis.

As proof of replacement or installation, the District may require an inspection by the designated Water Conservation Coordinator before issuing any rebates. The customer must complete a rebate request form prior to any credit being issued.

Rebates will be issued as a credit on the customer's water bill; landlords and other property owners that are not the direct water consumer but pay for listed devices permanently installed on their property will receive a check by mail. Rebates will be available until the total amount funded for the program in any fiscal year is exhausted; thereafter, customers may reapply for rebates not issued in future fiscal years.

The District will be the final arbiter of whether a device qualifies for the Rebate Program.
